INFORMATION FOR NEWLY ARRIVED RESIDENTS IN GUITING POWER



WELCOME

A warm welcome to the village of Guiting Power, included is information that we hope will enable you to quickly settle in and enjoy your new home.

OVERVIEW

The village is unusual for its size in having a Bakery/Village shop, boutique Café with Post Office services, Village hall, Children's Playgroup, and two public houses. To a large extent, the village owes its preservation to the *Guiting Manor Amenity Trust*, founded by Raymond Cochrane in the early 1970s.

HISTORY OF GUITING POWER

Recorded variously as Lower Guiting, Guiting Inferior, Nether Guiting, and Guiting Power, the latter was adopted in the 1940s. The name from 'Guiting', (old English) 'a flooded place' and 'Power', from the le Poer family who held the Manor in the early 1200s.

Archaeological evidence supports occupation from the Bronze Age. The nuclear village first developed around the Saxon Chapel and later, around the Square. Religious dogma and Manorial Law shaped and ordered the social and economic life of this typical medieval manor. Apart from the industrial 'boom and bust' of the Guiting Power Stone Pipe Company in the early 1800s, agriculture and its service industries were the mainstay of the community. However, from the late 19th century, a declining rural economy with lack of investment caused severe dilapidations in many houses leaving some roofless and uninhabitable. In 1968, The Manor lands and over half of the housing stock was purchased by Raymond Cochrane bringing with him the requisite vision and capital to renovate the houses and develop the infrastructure. Before his death in 2008, Mr. Cochrane established the Guiting Manor Amenity Trust to oversee the estate's interests in this working village.

GREEN SPACES/WALKS

The Wardens Way passes through the village, on its 14-mile (23 km) route from Bourton on the Water to Winchcombe passing close by the church. It joins the Oxfordshire Way to the Cotswold Way and can be combined with the Windrush Way to make a circular route. It passes through Guiting Power and other Cotswold villages, Naunton, Lower Slaughter and Upper Slaughter. The Manor Farm provides permissive access to areas of the farm these are clearly signed.
